Note:

The underlying monthly data can be volatile, particularly for the less populated regions (such as Queensland - Outback). ABS notes that the changes arising from the introduction of the ASGS, together with the introduction of the new sample is likely to cause disturbance to regional statistics from the Labour Force Survey. Regions in more remote areas will be more subject to disturbances than those in less remote areas. Therefore, data are smoothed and presented based on a 12-month moving average by BITRE.

The September 2019 national unemployment rate is 5.3 per cent (trend basis) and the 12 month moving average rate is 5.1 per cent.
